The evolution of the Military Health System (MHS) from a traditional model to a system of managed care precipitated a fundamental shift in the design and delivery of health care. These MHS changes mirror trends in the civilian sector:

orientation to prevention and health promotion; a more quantitative approach to quality of care; and a customer-focused approach. The MHS has always provided health promotion and preventive medicine (HP/PM) services. In the current prevention-oriented system, however, HP/PM becomes a focal point in the continuum of care by contributing to cost savings or cost avoidance in addition to providing high quality, customer-focused care tailored to the MHS population. This paper will propose the elements of a health system that delivers HP/PM as a focal point, describe the transition of the MHS to a prevention approach, and discuss the work that needs to be done to achieve an accountable, comprehensive prevention-oriented system. The MHS has the opportunity to emerge as a model health care delivery system. The Air Force Medical Service (AFMS) currently runs three in-theater hospitals for severely injured or wounded personnel. Part of the practitioners' preparation was treating DoD beneficiaries for a broad range of injuries and illnesses. Opportunities for this preparation are not as numerous "in house" as they once were, and AFMS does not always get proper credit for those gained elsewhere. the profile of e-commerce in national and regional development agendas. The 2nd Implementation Review (IR) was done in 2021 with an improved methodology, building on the lessons learned and feedback received by the different stakeholders involved in the first implementation review process. It highlights 140 new achievements from 14 countries that have participated in the 2nd IR, gathered through an in-depth review of the data collected from in-country stakeholders by the eT Ready Focal Points, in collaboration with a wide range of stakeholders from line ministries, regulatory agencies and private sector entities. The 2nd IR was completed in early 2022 with the publication of this report.
