Espaços públicos abertos de circulação de pedestres e o usuário cadeirante Feb 14 2020 De acordo com dados do Censo 2000, 24,5 milhões de brasileiros possuem algum tipo de deficiência, o que corresponde a 14,5% da população. Em São Paulo, chega a 1 milhão. Estes números ressaltam a importância da questão da acessibilidade ambiental aos portadores de deficiências. O objetivo principal deste estudo foi a determinação dos fatores limitantes na utilização do sistema de circulação de pedestres, pelo cadeirante. Esta pesquisa procurou verificar se estes espaços públicos cumprem sua função social sob a ótica do uso e da integração das pessoas de cadeiras de rodas. É apresentada uma discussão sobre a legislação de acessibilidade ambiental, sobre o uso dos espaços públicos de circulação, bem como, sobre as características da deficiência e da inclusão social no Brasil. A escolha do estudo da utilização dos passeios públicos, pelos cadeirantes, justificou-se por duas razões: em primeiro lugar, porque se tratam de espaços-chave na questão da acessibilidade ao representar a interligação entre o público e o privado e em segundo lugar, porque o cadeirante requer adaptações especiais que, ao serem atendidas, indiretamente, atingem outros grupos de pessoas como o idoso, o usuário de muletas, a gestante, o indivíduo com carrinho de bebê, enfim, toda a sociedade. A pesquisa de campo procurou verificar as condições de uso dos passeios públicos nos Distritos Sé e República, área central do Município de São Paulo. Partindo-se do pressuposto que um ambiente não deve ser avaliado somente pelos seus aspectos técnicos, mas também pela ótica de quem

utiliza o espaço, optou-se pela aplicação de uma avaliação comportamental, variável básica da Avaliação Pós-Ocupação (APO). Destaca-se a importância em se conhecer o ponto de vista dos cadeirantes e dos não cadeirantes, para se poder propor soluções técnicas e políticas públicas. Os resultados deste trabalho permitiram constatar o estado de conservação e uso dos espaços públicos de circulação, hierarquizar os seus principais problem.

Overall, the book argues that the battle ground of agrarian conflicts has moved to the field of food provisioning and using this approach has the potential to reframe the debate about the future of food and agriculture in Colombia and beyond. Financing of the Private Sector in Mexico, 2000-2005 Oct 16 2022 The objective of this paper is to describe the evolution, composition, and determinants of financing to the nonfinancial private sector in Mexico between 2000 and 2005. Supported by the macroeconomic environment and financial system reforms, total financing to the private sector (particularly consumer credit) increased relative to GDP, while accessibility and affordability generally improved. Equity issuance did not play an important role during the period under consideration. Although the supply of financing shifted toward domestic nonbank providers, commercial banks remain the primary source of funding. Significant progress was made in cleaning up bank loan portfolios and in strengthening financial system soundness and infrastructure. The prospects for continued private sector financing growth remain very positive, but financing is not spread out evenly across all market segments. The authors

conclude with some policy implications to further facilitate deeper and broader financing of the private sector.

By now, already a decade has passed since our conference section took place and it is due to various circumstances that this volume has not been published earlier. It carries along, in some sense, its own migration trace.

Nevertheless, the questions examined in the contributions have reached even more relevance since then in both, the Old World and the New, due to the various political, social, economic and ecological crisis around the globe that have led to the increased arrival of refugees to Europe and the harsh discussion about a concrete or “intelligent” wall to shield the USA from Latin American migrants, among others. Today, there is an urgent political and social need for concepts of living together in much more heterogeneous and much less familiar societies. The questions, notions and cases explored in the nine contributions that comprise this publication focus on this emergency.
